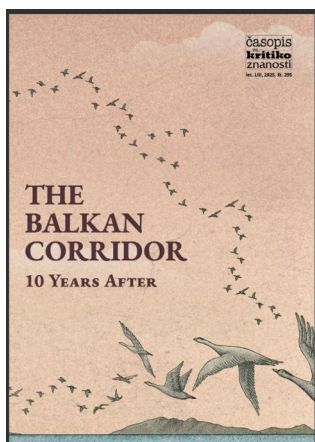
Dear friends.



80 activists, delegations from 15 cities, plenary sessions and working groups in 6 languages: We'll Come United's exchange and strategy meeting in Darmstadt in early March 2026 exceeded our own expectations. Important agreements were reached regarding joint mobilisations and decentralised actions. There were in-depth internal discussions, including on challenges in the processes of self-organisation. Furthermore, the refaced website and the newly published book provide a collective framework for further stabilising or even expanding the germanwide network with its transnational connections in the coming months.

There will be a greater need than ever for reliable structures within transnational networks as the next wave of attacks on the rights of refugees and migrants looms this year, with the introduction of CEAS and return hubs, alongside the EU-wide tightening of mi-

gration controls. Far-right and fascist parties and organisations are emulating the ICE model from the US, whilst the supposed firewalls have already degenerated into mere decorative hedges.



In a transnational context, we would like to recommend two recent publications. Firstly, friends from Ljubljana have published a comprehensive book: „The Balkan Corridor – 10 Years After“. Secondly, Border Forensics has published an in-depth study on the deadly developments in the English Channel: „How ‘Stopping the Boats’ Kills...“. Secondly, two further comments on the situation in Italy: Meloni suffered a heavy defeat in the referendum on so-called judicial reform on 22–23 March, which is likely to have repercussions beyond this vote. And a few days later, on 28 March 2026, – in parallel with the No Kings mobilisations in the US – over 100,000

people took part in a mass demonstration in Rome against the post-fascist government. The central mobilisation slogan here was: “Together Against Kings and Their Wars”.

DATES AND INFORMATION FOR APRIL 2026

WE'LL COME UNITED PLANS FOLLOWING THE STRATEGY MEETING



Up to 80 activists from 15 cities gathered in Darmstadt from 6 to 8 March 2026 for a We'll Come United exchange and strategy meeting. Once again, it became clear that the germanwide network is an important point of reference for both old and new local/regional groups. The trans-

lation of the plenary sessions and workshops into up to six languages highlights the diversity of our network.

A decentralised chain of action was discussed and agreed upon for 2026, in which local and regional mobilisations in the coming months will be interconnected in accordance with the respective conditions: through joint promotion on the new WCU website (see calendar) and on social media, through joint materials, and through delegation visits and meetings in which the WCU network will be presented and experiences and challenges of continuous self-organisation will be discussed. The WCU book, which will be published in March 2026 and presented for the first time at the Leipzig Book Fair, should also contribute to this.

Several workshops were also held, in which, on the one hand, it was decided that WCU would participate in mobilising the 'widersetzen' alliance on 4 July 2026 against the AfD party conference in Erfurt. WCU will be visible there with its own block and its own demands. On the other hand, there were important internal discussions about experiences with 'swarming,' i.e., visits and mobilisations of refugees in isolated camps, key issues of self-organisation, as well as contradictions within migrant communities and within the network in view of wars in more and more countries of origin. There was also an exchange about the successful regularisation campaign in Spain and what we can learn from it. The newly designed WCU website was also presented, which is now being continuously updated and further developed. And an enlarged group was formed to take care of consolidating and expanding the use of social media.

All participants enjoyed an inspiring weekend, during which networking processes were deepened, new contacts were made and many concrete plans and ideas were developed to continue the joint struggle for freedom of movement and equal social rights.

18 APRIL IN THE BORDER TRIANGLE BETWEEN FRANCE, SWITZERLAND AND GERMANY: DEMONSTRATION FOR BORDERLESS SOLIDARITY



“Groups from the border triangle are calling for a protest action at the borders of Switzerland, France and Germany. We oppose the deadly policies of the European asylum system and campaign for a world in which people can move freely. We live in the border triangle, both within and beyond national borders. We are people with and without passports. Our solidarity unites us. With the reform of the Common European Asylum System (CEAS), which comes into force on 12 June 2026, the right to asylum for refugees is being fundamentally undermined at every level. The EU

countries – including Switzerland – are pursuing a policy of sealing off that deprives people of their rights and forces them into irregularity. The individual right to asylum is being undermined by regulations, and refugees are being held in detention centres at the EU’s external borders for months. Within the countries themselves, too, more and more grounds for detaining refugees are being created. European countries, through their companies and banks, are complicit in causing war, destruction and the root causes of flight. That is why, on 18 April 2026, we will take to the streets together for a society based on solidarity, for the right to freedom of movement and against violence at the borders!...”

RETURN HUBS – THE NEW "RETURN REGULATION"

Pro Asyl:

"On Thursday, 26 March, the European Parliament voted on the new 'Return Regulation'. This regulation provides for severe infringements of human rights: deportation centres outside the EU, even for children, and long or even indefinite periods of detention for those seeking protection.

The agreement in the relevant EU Committee on Home Affairs was reached partly through collaboration with the far right. Behind the scenes, negotiations even took place with an AfD MEP: there is no longer any trace of the much-cited 'firewall'...

Deportations without limits thanks to 'return hubs'

The European Parliament has voted on a new return law. Conservatives and the far right want to give member states a free hand in this regard. The Return Regulation is intended to make it easier to remove people required to leave – primarily rejected asylum seekers, but also people who are not allowed or do not wish to go through the asylum process – from the EU. And, where possible, even if they cannot be deported to their own country of origin. To this end, measures include tightening reporting requirements, expanding detention options and restricting legal remedies.

Above all, however, it is intended to make it easier to deport people to third countries. In October 2024, European Commission President Ursula von der Leyen (CDU) proposed the establishment of so-called ‘return hubs’ as an ‘innovative approach to combating illegal migration’. In practice, the return hubs are likely to be detention centres outside the EU, to which people, whom the EU wishes to remove, are taken for an indefinite period. In March 2025, she presented a draft of the return regulation, and in December 2025, the EU interior ministers gave their approval. (...)

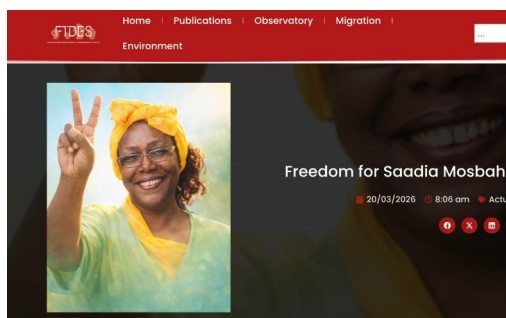
At the EU interior ministers’ meeting in January in Nicosia, Cyprus, Germany, Austria, Denmark, the Netherlands and Greece set up a working group to prepare the return hubs. Possible agreements with third countries are expected to be in place as early as 2026, said Interior Minister Alexander Dobrindt (CSU). The return hubs should “ideally be established in African states that would be prepared to take in rejected asylum seekers”, said Greek Migration Minister Thanos Plevris. ...“

TUNISIAN FORUM FOR ECONOMIC AND SOCIAL RIGHTS: FREEDOM FOR SAADIA MOSBAH



„On the evening of Thursday, March 19, the Court of First Instance in Tunis issued shocking and unjust verdicts in the so-called “Mnemty” Association case. Activist Saadia Mosbah—who has been detained for 681 days—is being prosecuted alongside eight other activists from the association who remain free, solely for their legitimate work

in combating racism and hate speech.

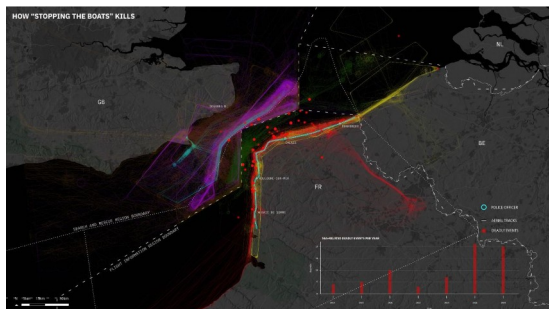
The court sentenced Saadia Mosbah to eight years of immediate imprisonment, while the other activists received sentences ranging from one to three years. This ruling represents a serious blow to the principles of justice and the freedom of civic action. Despite the defense team’s strong and well-founded arguments, which clearly exposed serious legal violations and the absence of evidence supporting the charges, these verdicts were delivered in blatant disregard for the fundamental principles of a fair trial. Saadia Mosbah’s arrest must also be understood within a broader context, where narratives are being used to justify unjust policies aligned with European Union migration con-

trol agendas—policies that risk turning Tunisia into a hostile environment for migrants and for those who stand in solidarity with them, effectively contributing to the externalization of European border control..."

NEW INVESTIGATION BY BORDER FORENSICS ON THE ENGLISH CHANNEL: HOW 'STOPPING THE BOATS' KILLS...



„How ‘stopping the boats’ kills presents findings from a year-long collaborative investigation by researchers at the ESRC Centre for Sociodigital Futures at the University of Bristol, and Border Forensics, an independent research agency based in Geneva, Switzerland. The report demonstrates how the UK government’s ‘Stop

the Boats’ policies, and over £625 million given to the French to prevent departures, have directly contributed to a sharp rise in deaths of people attempting to cross the Channel in so-called small boats.

Drawing on data from migrant solidarity activists in northern France, French coastguard records, and UK Home Office transparency data, this investigation identifies a dramatic surge in fatal incidents beginning Summer 2023. Crucially, **this rise in deaths came as the numbers of dinghies and people arriving to the UK fell**, and despite an increase in aerial surveillance and maritime search-and-rescue capacity.

Geospatial analysis showed these increased deaths occurred closer to French shores, and interviews with activists and migrants revealed them to be the result of new deadly mechanisms: **extreme overcrowding**, resulting in people being crushed inside of dinghies, and **chaotic launches**, often in the midst of violent police interventions to prevent departures. The entangled effects of three border policing practices behind these mechanisms are examined in detail in the report:

—1—**‘Upstream’ anti-smuggling measures and supply-chain disruption:** International cooperation has reduced the availability of dinghies and other materials needed for small boat journeys, leading facilitators to source larger and lower quality inflatables which are increasingly overcrowded. Anti-smuggling measures have also reduced the opportunities for under-resourced groups to organise their own journeys—strengthening the hold of professionalised smugglers on the market—and fuelled competition for places onboard.

—2—**Expanded aerial surveillance:** Although framed primarily in terms of supporting search and rescue operations, analysis of flight tracks and state documentation showed most aerial surveillance of the Channel is focused on coordinating police patrols on the ground, and gathering data and intelligence for prosecutions. By enabling faster detection and police intervention, surveillance has contributed to overcrowding and the advent of new dangerous tactics for small boat departures.

—3— **Increased police activity on the French coast:** The ever larger numbers of police on the French coast, funded by the UK, has altered the geography of small boat departures, and driven the adoption of the ‘taxi boats’ which present greater risks for travellers who must board dinghies already afloat. Police’s violent tactics, especially the use of riot control weapons such as tear-gas, stun grenades, and rubber bullets, have also directly endangered travellers and led to panics, crushes, and people drowning in shallow waters. The report demonstrates how these border policing practices, which authorities claim ‘save lives’ by preventing crossing attempts, have amplified the risks facing people compelled to make illegalised journeys to reach the UK. It also shows that British and French officials knew, or ought to have known, the deadly consequences of their policies. Decades of increased security and policing at the UK’s externalised border have not ended illegalised journeys and, despite being a political priority since 2019, small boat journeys have not stopped. As this report shows, greater enforcement has not only failed to achieve its stated objective, but led to more deaths in the Channel. Whether this reality can be recognised by policy-makers and prompt a fundamental reassessment of UK border externalisation remains an open question. For now, as the next phase of bilateral cooperation for 2026-29 is set to begin, the UK government appears determined to continue using large payments to leverage the French to adopt ever riskier tactics to police its border, regardless of the human costs....”

From the editorial introduction:



„...The European border regime, and with it the Balkan route, is a tool for maintaining the existing capitalist relations that drive masses of people to seek safety and a decent life abroad, despite travel restrictions. Irregular migrants are a fundamental reality of global inequality, as reflected in the unequal distribution of the right to movement. It is precisely the restriction of the right to movement that creates a situation of lawlessness, enabling extreme forms of exploitation in the fields of Italy and Spain and on construction sites, in slaughterhouses, and in factories across Europe. However, every now and

then, the circumstances of these relationships lead to mass movements that even border regimes are unable to contain. One such event was the long summer of migration in 2015 and the subsequent formation of the Balkan corridor, when the European border regime was temporarily suspended and over a million people entered Europe irregularly. This year marks a decade since this event irrevocably changed the movement of people and perceptions of migration among the European public and politicians. While irregular

migration was more of a crime story before 2015, today it is at the forefront of political debate, with politicians competing with promises on who will provide more deportations. The challenges faced by migrants in their efforts to improve their chances of regularisation are also at the forefront, as demonstrated by the Spanish citizens' initiative to regularise half a million irregular migrants in 2024. In Slovenia, a recent example of this is the introduction of the possibility for asylum seekers to transition to migrant worker status.

Irregular migration on the Balkan route dates back well before the corridor period, but it seems that the period of mass movements in 2015 and the subsequent formation and closure of the internationally organised corridor in March 2016 represent a point of no return in the perception of migration and the course of migration movements in the Balkans. In the years following the closure of the corridor, countries introduced practices of brutal police violence, intending to implement deterrence policies. While at the same time, it was precisely these violent police practices and state crimes that became points of political mobilisation, bringing together local civic initiatives and people on the move in the struggle for an equal and just society.

To reflect on what the years 2015 and 2016 represent and how border regimes, the movement of people, and the political organisation of the migrant struggles have changed over the last ten years, we have prepared this issue of the Journal for the Critique of Science...“

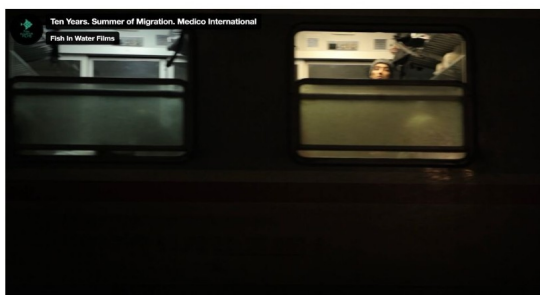

30 MAY AT FRANKFURT AIRPORT AGAINST DEPORTATIONS

“Welcome United Rhein/Main is calling for a demonstration at Frankfurt Airport on 30 May 2026 at 2 pm in Terminal 1

A third of all deportations from Germany take place via Frankfurt Airport. In 2025, there were just about 20,000 deportations by air, 7,700 of which were via Frankfurt Airport. More than 5,000 deportations took place to other European countries under the Dublin Regulation.

The pressure to deport is mounting; the authorities are using the decline in arrivals to reject asylum applications more quickly and are focusing on increasing deportation figures. With the introduction of the CEAS reform (Common European Asylum System reform), the problem will become even more acute.

The new Terminal 3 is set to open at Frankfurt Airport on 23 April. Part of the new building is an expanded deportation centre. By 2027, twice as many deportations are expected to take place from there as previously from Frankfurt.

We must stand up against this! We will not stand alone. Against fear. Solidarity will win!

On 30 May 2026, we will express our rejection of these inhumane and violent policies loud and clear. Deportations are the problem – not the solution!

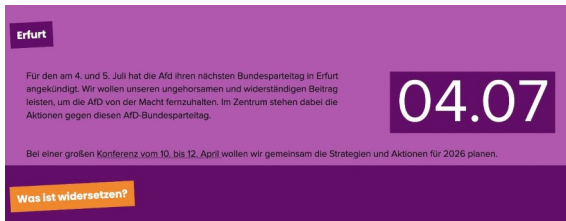
